God will not forsake His

"FOR ALL THE SAINTS"

Dear Friends In Christ,

November has a few days of celebration in it. Veterans Day and Thanksgiving Day are two of them. On **November 11, Veterans Day** we celebrate all men and women who have served in the Armed Forces.

On **Thanksgiving Day**, the fourth Thursday of the month, our government tells us to go and worship our God.

Another Day of celebration for the church is on **November 1**, **All Saints Day**. Martin Luther said several times that he was "*simul iustus et peccator*." These words are in Latin. In English it means, "*simultaneously justified and sinner*." Or as many like to put it, we are saints, (having been justified and forgiven), and sinner at the same time. All Saints Day is a day we celebrate the dearly departed. They have become justified saints. They can no longer sin. We are saints also when we are forgiven by God, and yet we continue to sin.

Here is the beginning of the blurb on the website 1517.org about this saying of Martin Luther:

The phrase, "simultaneously justified and sinner," or simul iustus et peccator (simul for short), is a statement or confession concerning the Christian life in this world. While the saying is simple, unpacking its implications can take some time due to the number of doctrines which support it. Below is a look at both what is meant mean by claiming the *simul* as a confession, as well as an exploration of the doctrines this phrase confesses. I aim to provide a simple introduction to a topic which, all too often, has been sadly misunderstood.

A Confession:

It's important to make the distinction between confession and doctrine to fully understand what being simultaneously justified and sinner means. For Christians, the word confession has two meanings. The first is a profession of faith or belief; the second is the admitting and repentance of sin. In both senses of the word, confession requires an acknowledgment of certain truths or realities. Historical confessions include the catholic creeds such as the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds, publicly presented documents like the Augsburg Confession or Westminster Confession of Faith, and teaching documents such as catechisms. Confessions are meant to be exclusive. Simply put, confessions in this sense are made up of doctrines or teachings.

By virtue of a confession's affirmation of a particular doctrine or doctrines, they simultaneously include positive statements and exclude any antithetical teachings to what is confessed. For example, when one confesses with the Apostles' Creed that Christ was truly God and truly man who rose from the dead, he or she also rejects the teaching that Christ remained dead and all the implications that carries toward his nature as the God-man. Following this principle, the simul makes several affirmations and rejections on the doctrines of sin/original sin, justification, and sanctification, to name a few.¹

Please go to the website printed below if you wish to read the rest of the article. May we celebrate all the faithful departed every All Saints Day and give thanks and praise to Jesus for making all of us saints.

CHURCH UP DATE CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

OCTOBER 17, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Gaide and Pastor Hauter began the meeting with prayer. Members in attendance were Kris Bruun, Pastor Hauter, Tom Gaide, John Aggson, Scott Harberts, JoAnn Collins, Janelle Sheppard, JoAnn Russ, and Evelyn Daberkow. The minutes from the September council meeting were approved.

JoAnn Collins, Director, Board of Early Childhood Education — JoAnn gave a brief update of the ELA. We currently have 18 children in Pre-K, with 9 in the morning and 9 in the afternoon. There are 6 in the Preschool room, with more coming next week. We have a wait list in the Toddler room, with 4 in attendance now.

President Gaide reviewed the items to be brought to the voters meeting next Sunday:

- Our constitution has been revised and will be reviewed by voters on Sunday.
- The list of voting members has been reviewed and updated by the elders. The full congregational list of members will also be updated by the elders, but this does not need to be done right now.
- A motion was brought by the elders to extend Pastor Hauter's contract for an additional six months. The original contract runs through April 2025. This will extend his contract to October 2025 and will be voted on at Sunday's voters meeting.

John Aggson, Board of Trustees – John described the current status of our roof repairs. The gutter and drain close to the 1^{st} – 2^{nd} grade classroom have been cleared. Derion Ibarra has received a quote of \$4250 from Jeremy Halfacre to do a temporary fix for that area. We still need to repair the roof over the old gym (where the five school classrooms are located), as the room at the end of the hall has serious water damage. John has inspected the sink in the altar guild area. Because of the age of the pipe, it would be quite difficult to repair without tearing out the wall.

Jeff Schuster, owner of the corner property that was occupied by Pueblo Community College, has inquired about renting parking spaces in our back lot. He is interested in six or seven spaces for his next tenant. We need to check with city zoning to make sure renting to him would not impact our parking requirement. John will also negotiate with Mr. Schuster on the price for parking. He also has security patrolling his property and has volunteered to have them walk around our property as well to discourage any overnight "sleepers".

John also reported that we have hired Angel Walker back as our custodian. He made a motion that we authorize her pay at \$16.00/hour. This is a budget item that will also be brought to the voters meeting on Sunday.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with prayer led by Evelyn Daberkow, reading from Philippians chapter 4 - I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

CHURCH VOTERS MINUTES

OCTOBER 20, 2024

President Tom Gaide called the meeting to order and Pastor Hauter opened with prayer and a devotion. 18 members were present. Minutes from the July voters meeting were approved.

Pastor Hauter – Pastor invited everyone to sign up to attend a cottage meeting. He encourages us to be a community. We are a WE. We work together, not as individuals. He also encouraged us to be positive.

We had one baptism in September, Kayliegh Gibson.

His current Bible study will be completed soon. He has two students in confirmation class. Lucky Schneberger stated he is giving confirmation lessons with Mary Thompson. She is attending flight school here in Pueblo as part of her military training and plans to become a drone pilot. She will be done with her training on November 6.

Pastor has submitted his quarterly intentional interim report to the district. This included information on what kind of pastor we want and need. He stated we need a pastor with strengths in outreach, leading Bible studies, and uniting the church, school, and child care together.

Janelle Sheppard for JoAnn Collins, Director, Board of Childhood Education — We currently have 18 children in Pre-K, with 9 in the morning and 9 in the afternoon. There are 7 in the Preschool room. We have a wait list in the Toddler room, with 4 in attendance until we get an assistant.

Kris Bruun, Treasurer — Kris submitted a summary of our income and outgo. Our first check from the Home School Enrichment Program has been received in the amount of \$10,750. Additionally, Principal Ibarra has secured a grant from the Southern Colorado Community Foundation for \$30,000. This has greatly improved our financial situation.

John Aggson, Board of Trustees — Roof leaks continue to plague us. We previously replaced the roof with the exception of the roof over the old gym (where the five school classrooms are located). It is this old roof that needs our attention now. John estimates it will cost at least \$50,000 to

replace, due, in part, to the high cost of labor to move the gravel on the roof.

We have hired Angel Walker back as our custodian. Lucky Schneberger made a motion that her salary be set at \$16.00/hour. Janelle Sheppard seconded his motion and it was approved.

To improve security on our property, John is looking to install a grate on the Lincoln Street stairway that leads to the basement. He is also looking at options to secure the area by the library.

John stated that Jeff Schuster, owner of the corner property that was occupied by Pueblo Community College, has inquired about renting parking spaces in our back lot. He is interested in six or seven spaces for his next tenant. John will be checking with city zoning on our parking requirements and then negotiate with Mr. Schuster on the price for parking. Mr. Schuster has also volunteered to have his security team walk around our property to discourage any overnight "sleepers".

Scott Harberts, Board of Elders — They have updated the voter member list and removed individuals if they have not attended a voters meeting in more than a year. Randy Daberkow and Earl Graves have replaced the outdoor American and Christian flags. Scott made a motion for Lucky Schneberger to be named as our representative to the next convention. This was seconded and approved.

Evelyn Daberkow for Derion Ibarra, Principal, Board of Education – The teachers were at the district conference last week. She was pleased to announce that JoAnn Collins was awarded the Early Childhood Director of the Year.

Tomorrow, October 21st the students will be going to the Colon Orchards Pumpkin Patch in Canon City. The Trunk or Treat is set for Friday, October 25, from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m. There will be no school on November 1 for parent-teacher conferences. They will be packing boxes soon for Operation Christmas Child.

Principal Ibarra has recommended a classical education curriculum program for our school that the board will be reviewing in the weeks to come. Tom Gaide encouraged the board to make sure all our teachers have an up-to-date certification.

Old Business: None

New Business:

- JoAnn Russ reviewed the changes made to constitution and bylaws, recommended by the district. Lucky Schneberger seconded the motion brought from the council to approve these changes. Randy Daberkow questioned why a change was proposed to eliminate the need for a new voter to wait until the next meeting before that person can vote. After discussion, Randy moved we leave the prior wording in the bylaws requiring new voters to wait until the next meeting before voting. Scott Harberts seconded the motion, which was approved with a unanimous vote.
- Scott Harberts brought a motion from the elders to extend Pastor Hauter's contract for an additional six months. The original contract runs through April 2025. This will extend his contract to October 2025. Kris Bruun seconded the motion, which was approved by the voters.
- Tom Gaide pointed out that our election for officers will be held in December. We really need a new president and a vice president. Cathy Coffey noted that the men in the congregation need to step up to their responsibilities.

There being no further business, the meeting closed with singing the Doxology.
